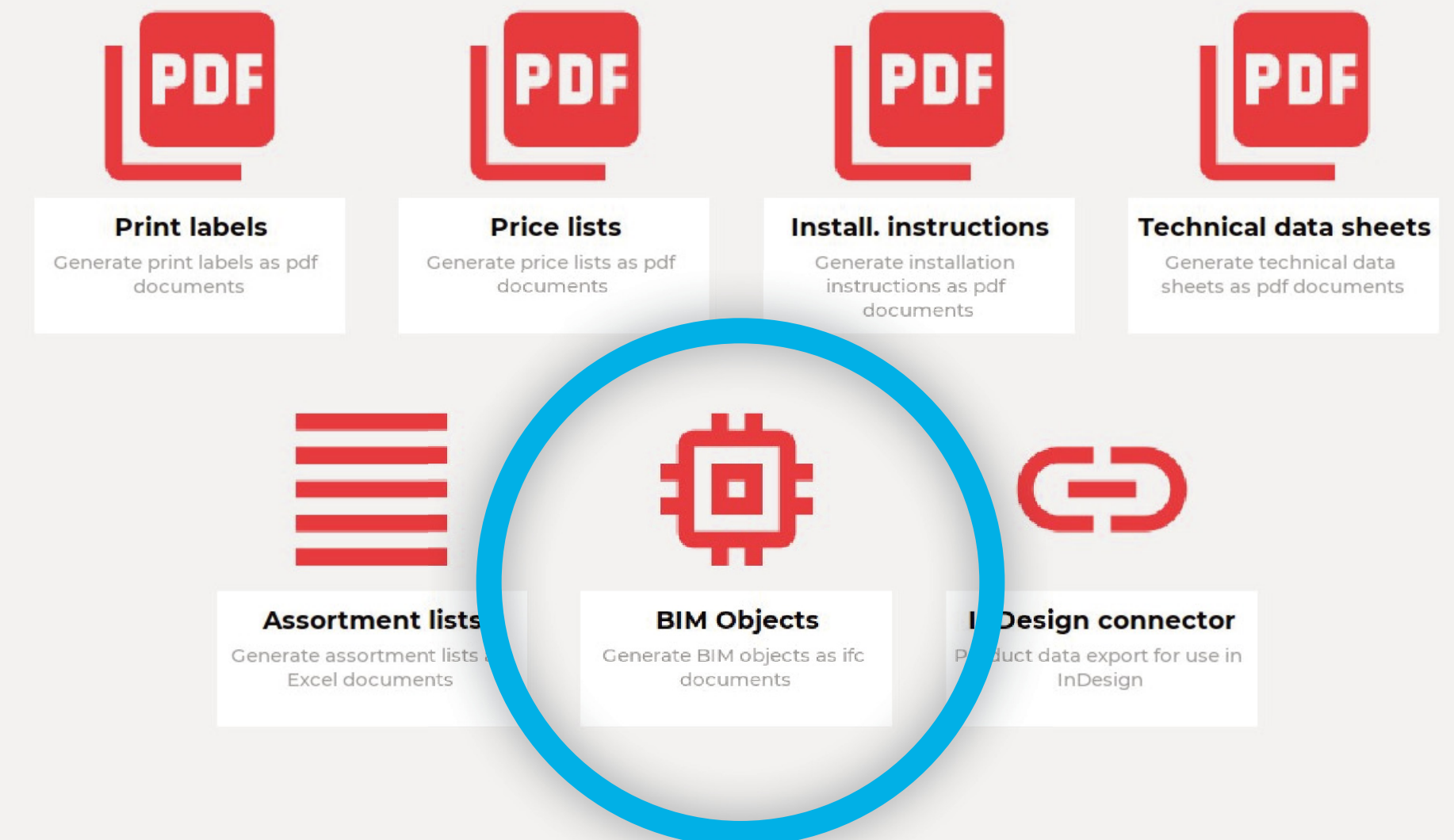
The geometric data, classifications and graphic textures of your products are maintained centrally in the Marketingmanager. Data changes to existing BIM objects are checked by rule based and automatically update the export data. The Marketingmanager BIM module simplifies and accelerates the workflow for creating and distributing your BIM objects.

The IFC file creation process is based on the OpenBIM standard and enables data acquisition in BIM-enabled applications as well as seamless integration of your products into building projects and tenders.

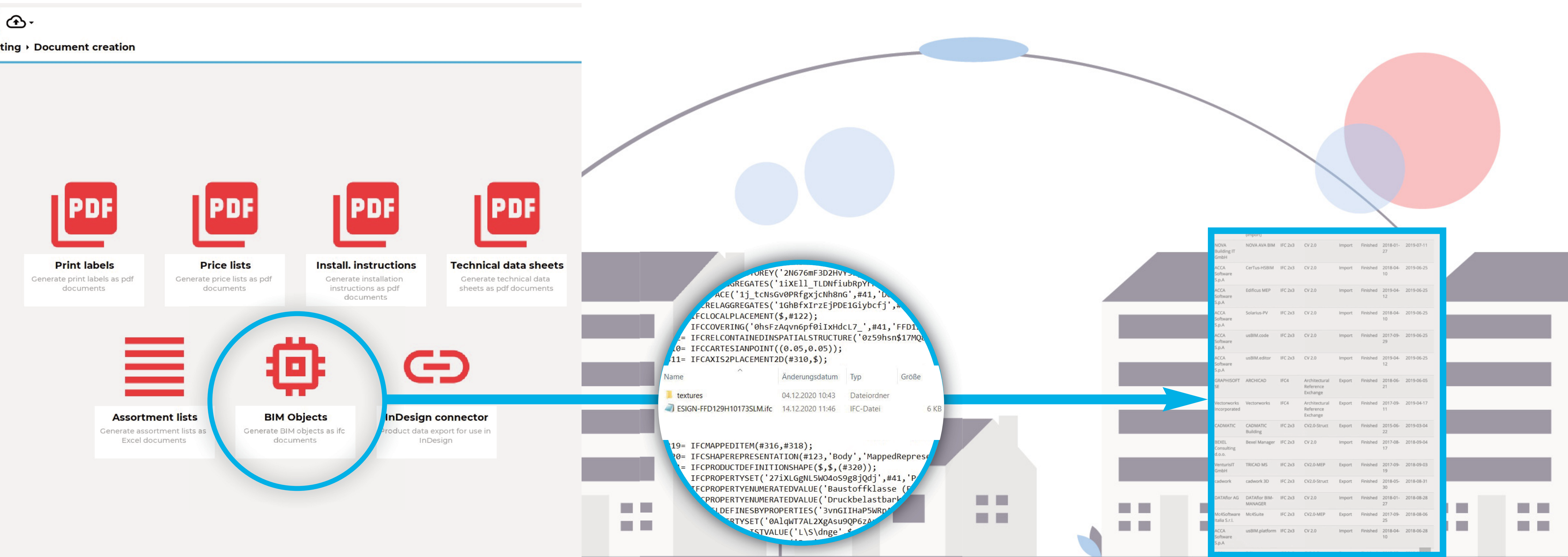
